We are pleased to announce the re-emergence of the only Canadian journal for medical educators and scholars. A new issue of the Canadian Medical Education Journal (<u>www.cmej.ca</u>) is now available and we are definitely back in business.

The current issue showcases several very exciting articles with strong Canadian content and implications for medical education across the globe. From BC to the Rock, authors and editors from across Canada have made this issue possible. Our material covers stress and resilience, education opportunities, and clinical skills training for medical student as well as research training, intimidation and harassment, burnout, and job prospects for residents. This issue is also our first under new management.
